The regular monthly meeting of the Foster Township Supervisors was held at the Municipal Building.

Copies of the minutes of the previous meeting minutes were given to the Supervisors there were no corrections minutes stand approved.

Public Comment:

Mr. Frank Zuckus held on discussion of the development of the truck plaza.

Reports Prologics will vacate by the end of May.

Right to know request from Richard Burmeister for 12 months itemized bills for Mt. Pleasant Hose Co.

Right to Know officer Richard Zula reports on several Municipalities and Hose Companies in the area and their process of paying bills for the fire companies.

Gene Maley questions what impact will transfer of \$ 1,000,000.00 to FNCB will have on accounts remaining in the First National Bank, Minersville.

A discussion by Francis Poslosky on waterline and upgrade to help with fire protection. A Motion was made to have Benesch research for preliminary plans for a waterline upgrade By Zula second by Carr.

Solicitors Report:

Biosolids- discussion held on a odor monitor and participation with Cass Township.

A Letter was sent to Erie Insurance for the Municipal Authority workers comp to be terminated.

A Deed was presented for transfer from the Municipal Authority to Kitty Bosack. Update on Albright property- Brennan advises proper equipment is needed to remove garbage from Albright property. A Motion was made to have Chief Nettles to get quote on removal of rubbish by Zula second by Carr all in favor.

Engineer's Report :

Property maintenance: A site visit was completed at 1468 Sunbury Road and the property was posted condemned.

Hill Waterline: a site meeting with the contractor was held the proposed work requires coordination with the homeowners.

Hill Cul-de-sac: A site visit with the township was held to discuss possible layout options.

Zoning Revision : Atty Brennan requested info on Misty Mountain Properties regarding the Zoning revisions.

Waterline Grant Investigation: Two potential projects that can be looked at for future funding are adding a secondary distribution line from the existing Blythe Township Municipal Authority water tank into Buck Run or the addition of a large capacity fire pump installation at the crystal water treatment plant. Either of these projects would likely exceed the allowable project cost of \$150,000 for the grant program.

Biosolids Odor Investigation: A call was placed to DEP district Mining Office to discuss what possible actions can be taken.

Road masters Report:

Lenick will backfill pit on Lower Beechwood Ave. A length of pipe will be bought for the project.
